We knew that if we are going to make a difference by "restoring hope one life at a time...", then we need to make sure that we are <u>united</u> as one; <u>ignited</u> by the fire of the Holy Spirit; and empowered to make an <u>impact</u> in our city.

UCM is blessed to be united with brothers and sisters in Christ from various other churches throughout the Tampa Bay community. We are currently connected with citylife church, LifePoint Church, Idlewild Baptist Church of Odessa, Watermark Church, Acacia Grove Church, and Life Springs Baptist Church. "TOGETHER" we are impacting our city with the love of God.

Because of people like you who have a heart of love and compassion for the poor and needy in our community, UCM was able to provide a lot of services to those in need in 2015. Below are just a few of these services:

 Assist a mom whose daughter was in the hospital in Virginia in a coma by providing her with a hotel room and transportation.

- Rental assistance and Christmas gifts for a couple with three children who lost their home in a fire.
- Supply moving assistance for a physically handicapped lady.
- Groceries for a single mom with five children.
- Volunteers gave 1,500 hours of various support and social services to 3,100 homeless and needy friends in our community.
- Served 4,000 plus meals to our hungry friends.

Brother Leon is and has been a friend to many people in the Sulphur Springs Community for a long time. As of late he has found many things going his way although throughout the years things haven't always been so great.

The UCM Operation Jumpstart Program provides the homeless with a hot meal every Saturday morning and Leon joins the group for breakfast. In the past UCM was blessed to be able to provide a place on Sunday to take showers, get personal hygiene items, shoes, a change of clothes, a haircut, and a hot lunch for our homeless friends. Leon has been homeless for many years and was able to avail himself of some of our services throughout that time. Leon has slept all over the streets of Tampa and his most recent home was in an abandoned church. During his time staying at the church Leon acted as the grounds keeper for the owner who allowed him to stay there. He has built a knowledge of and faith in our great God and makes sure to volunteer at church and attend Bible studies and services.

A few months back, things went from bad to worse for Leon. He was staying in the abandoned church without electricity, water, A/C or heat. Then an eviction notice was posted on the door with the demand that he vacate the property. That same week, Leon was diagnosed with cirrhosis of the liver. Now he not only has a very serious health condition, he is also being forced onto the streets again, and has no place to keep his beloved companion (his two-year-old dog named Venus).

While everything was looking pretty bad for Leon, some very loving volunteers from citylife church and UCM Operation Jumpstart came together to pray and assist, and our prayers were answered. Through the grace of God, Leon found out about Tampa Hillsborough Homeless Alliance's effort called Operation Reveille who assists the homeless veterans in finding a place to live. We went there together and Leon was able to get food, clothing, a suit, a bus pass, and an apartment for free and they also let him take his companion, Venus! The first thing he did when he got his place was to drop to his knees, put his head on the ground and pray thanks to God.

Psalms 55:22 says "Cast your cares on the LORD and he will sustain you; he will never let the righteous be shaken." Leon is in a much healthier environment for his condition now. Praise God! Now when we go to visit Leon at his apartment I am greeted by a smile, a wagging tail and there is always a Bible open on the table.
